The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

INGREDIENTS:

250g sultanas
250g chopped raisins
250g currants
125g chopped mixed peel
90g chopped red glace cherries
90g chopped blanched almonds
1/3 cup sherry or brandy
250g plain flour
60g self-raising flour
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
250g butter
250g soft brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
1/2 teaspoon almond essence
1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs

RECOMMENDED METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared **square 20 cm x 20 cm (8" x 8")** tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin. Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces. (All fruit and nuts should be the size of the smallest fruit eg. the currants).

Please note: The cooked cake should not exceed 5.7 cm in height.

2. Shearers are to be allocated two sheep and may pick the sheep they wish to shear first. The sheep will be given to the shearer by the rouseabout.
3. Shearer to announce start when ready to pull into gear. Timekeeper to keep the time. Time finishes when the shearer pulls out of gear.
4. Shearers will be asked to shear two sheep with a short break in between.
5. Only the fastest qualifying time of the two sheep is to be recorded.
6. To qualify, the shearer must receive a green card for that sheep. A red card and the shearer's time for that sheep is disqualified. The shearer is entitled to shear the second sheep should disqualification occur on the first. The second sheep is to be shorn under the same rules.
7. The six fastest qualifying times will progress to the finals.
8. The finals will be run in time order. Slowest to Fastest time.
9. Finals will be decided by the fastest time and receive a green card.
10. Sheep will be crutched and belly removed prior to the competition.
11. Judges will be local woolgrowers/shearers. The judge's decision is final.
12. Disqualification will occur for the following:
 - a. Cuts requiring excessive sewing (judge's decision)
 - b. Excessive second cuts/bad positioning
 - c. Mistreatment of sheep
